### How are EU13 countries doing in the H2020 new initiatives?

#### The case of the Fast Track to Innovation (FTI) first call – Pilot

Funding under the first FTI cut off shows the following results and trends:

- 269 proposals were submitted, of which 32 were led by a EU13 stakeholder (EU13 market share: 12%). 16 projects are funded, of which 2 led by EU13 stakeholders (EU market share: 12.5%).
- Success rate of EU13 stakeholders: 2 out of 32 = 6.25%, whilst for EU15 this is 14 out of 247, i.e. 5.9%.
- Four projects are involving EU13 partners (EU13 proportion: 1 project out of 4).
- There are 69 partners, of which 6 from EU13 countries (EU13 market share: 8.7%), but one project involves 3 Slovenian stakeholders.
- EU13 beneficiaries: 3 from Slovenia, 1 from Croatia, 1 from Romania and 1 from the Czech Republic.

→ Stakeholders of 10 EU13 Member States have led at least one proposal:

→ The project proposals came mostly from Spain (52), Italy (48) and the Netherlands (30).

- With regard to the sectors of activity of the funded projects:
  - 3 projects: Transport and Energy
  - 2 projects: ICT, Health, Advance material
  - 1 project: Environment, Food
- As far as the transnational links of EU13 projects are concerned, we see that:
  - The 3 Slovenian stakeholders are partnering with one French and one German partner
  - The Romanian stakeholder works with Irish, French and UK partners
  - The Czech stakeholder cooperates with Italian and German partners
  - The Croatian stakeholder's partners are located in the United Kingdom, Denmark and Belgium.
