## SOCIAL INNOVATION

Social innovation has been the cornerstone of ZSI since the institute's establishment more than 30 years ago. Together with our global network of partners, ZSI has had a hand in the establishment of social innovation as a guiding policy concept in Europe. ZSI subscribes to a pragmatic definition of social innovation as *“a new combination or figuration of practices in areas of social action, ... with the goal of better coping with needs and problems than is possible by use of existing practices. An innovation is therefore social to the extent that it varies social action, and is socially accepted and diffused in society. Depending on circumstances of social change, interests, policies and power, social ideas as well as successfully implemented SI may be transformed and ultimately institutionalised as regular social practice or made routine”* (Howaldt et al. 2014)<sup>2</sup>.

Social innovation is a cross-cutting topic. Thus, often social innovation is also an approach, a theme or an exploitation pathway employed in many other projects subsumed under other domains tackled by ZSI.

## TRANSFORMATION TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE SOCIETAL DEVELOPMENT

The scope of transformative third-generation policy goes well beyond that of previous R&I policies. The transformative approach needs social legitimacy and ZSI has been working on this since its foundation. We show how citizens and various stakeholder groups can ethically and meaningfully be involved in creating, steering and implementing transformative R&I towards environmental, social and economic sustainability. Our belief is that R&I is not merely done by generating new knowledge and innovation. To tackle societal challenges requires large-scale changes in society, social innovation as well as a different understanding and conduct of R&I and R&I policy-making. Our experts are experienced in tracing crosslinks, identifying preferences and shaping priorities in an effort to co-design roadmaps for future developments, which are appreciated by most stakeholders involved.

ZSI is often at the core of researching sustainable innovations, aiming to jointly analyse economic, environmental and social factors and the ways in which to balance them such that improvements in one area do not cause rebound effects in another.

## DIGITALISATION

Digital technologies have entered almost all spheres of social life, from workplaces to health, education, culture, science, sports and agriculture. The 2020 COVID-19 crisis has further boosted this omnipresence of digital communication channels, digitally mediated modes of collaboration, learning and expression, and the digital delivery of services and immaterial goods. As technologies are developing, the capacities of connectivity, space-independent computing power ('clouds') and artificial intelligence are on the increase. Digital technologies are entering ever more remote or unlikely contexts and formerly 'analogue' domains, such as care of children or the elderly. Almost everywhere, they are supporting and enhancing activities, interactions and access to knowledge and exchange. They are also extracting and utilising data from the most everyday practices for purposes that may enhance societies' capacities for self-organisation but are often enough opaque and/or commercially driven.

### Ageing, health and care

Europe is facing demographic challenges and uneven developments between ongoing urbanisation and shrinking and 'ageing' regions. As a consequence, fast changes in social life and in the provision of health and social services are to be expected. ZSI is engaged in minimising negative effects for disadvantaged persons and regions and developing those groups' and regions' capabilities. This generally requires successful and effective co-operation on the part of public, private, civil society and also research organisations. We advise public authorities and intermediate bodies on how to develop resilient policy interventions that aim at both sustainable economic growth and social cohesion. We address issues of health, care, ageing and demographic change through the transdisciplinary lens of our knowledge of regional development, social and labour market policies, our competencies in evaluating and facilitating co-creation processes and our understanding of the potential of social innovations in science and technology, such as RRI, CS and makerspaces.

### Integration and inclusion of migrants

Migration is a central feature of the human experience. This is true for migrants themselves as much as for their communities of origin, their destinations and possibly for those to whom they return. Much of this experience is not related to people's mobility as such. It is shaped by migrants' and receiving societies' mutual expectations and by the treatment of migrants by the societies and the people they encounter. It appears quite possible for societies to become both more interrelated and more exclusive. The focus of work at ZSI has been on enhancing the competence of municipalities and other levels of governance, as well as NGOs, social partner organisations and educational organisations to absorb migration productively and in accordance with human rights.
