with this edition we would like to bring the Austrian situation in media literacy in focus. Compared to the scene in Germany and other countries, the size is rather limited but for the international community some initiatives such as the "media literacy award" (mla) (see www.mediamanual.at/mla.html) are of special interest as they are open to participants from all over Europe. In particular, we would like to encourage you to put your projects forward in this competition! Video, radio, print media & comics, multimedia – in all these categories submission of entries is possible until the 31st of July. Every picture and every image counts! Diplomas will be awarded for the best and most innovative educational media projects in European schools. The prize winners will be notified by the end of September of the next school year and invited to attend an award ceremony. The competition is part of several initiatives of the Austrian Ministry for Education, Science and Culture in the field of media education – more information is available at www.mediamanual.at: the web site offers workshops and basic knowledge about media mediated communication (with or about media) in German.

International film contributions are also welcome to be sent to the "YOUKI 2005" – the 7th International Youth Media Festival (November 21 – 25, 2005) in Wels, Austria (www.youki.at) directly until September 23, 2005. Innovative ideas, cinematic visions, experiments in style, content and form, as well as all themes and genres are accepted. Film and video works of the last two years can be submitted. The festival will also host the award ceremony of the "mla".

Possibilities to show the work carried out by pupils and students in the field of media education, especially self-created media contents, are a highly motivating and educating factor and will be promoted by the European Centre for Media Literacy (ecml). The <u>content repository</u> on the **ecml website** (<u>www.ecml-eu.org</u>) presents a collection of links to multimedia resources from various sources on media literacy and related topics, and links to websites of international media literacy organisations and other sites of special interest to this topic. Currently 536 entries for the multimedia database and 177 for the links database are available (as of April 7, 2005).

The <u>conference website</u> already provides more information on the upcoming **ecml-event** "**Media Skills and Competence**" (May 26-27, 2005 in Tampere, Finland).

On the first conference day Dr. Liss Jeffrey from McLuhan Global Research Network, Toronto, Canada, will be the invited keynote speaker. Within the English sessions also the ecml project will be presented.

The session "Global University" will be chaired by Professor Tapio Varis, Unesco Chair in Global e-Learning and acting President of Global University System. There will be a Multicasting Videoconference by Frank Melli to several American universities through broadband Internet. Dr. Takeshi Utsumi, Vice President and Founder of GUS will present his talks with slides from New York on introduction on inter-cultural understanding, Global University System (GUS), and Globally Collaborative Environmental Peace Gaming (GCEPG). There will be an interlink to Taganrog State University of Radio Engineering in Russia assisted by Ksenia Avetisova. Doctoral students from different countries participate in the panel. There will also be a lecture on Non-Western theories of communication by professor (emeritus) K.S. Sitaram from Southern Illinois.

The other track on the first day will be in Finnish, and in these sessions the literacy of commercials, news, games and advertisements are discussed.

The second conference day includes also two tracks.

The scientific track of the conference will include Sessions on 'Identity', 'Education and new literacies', 'Competence and skills' and 'News literacy' and introduces interesting research papers from Russia, UK, Portugal and Finland. One of the keynote speakers will be Paul Lefrere from Microsoft UK.

The Finnish track is aimed at Finnish teachers and students. There will be workshops for both teachers and pupils, where facts and fiction within news, advertisements etc. are studied. Ideas and tools will be given to teachers on how to teach media literacy in their class rooms.

Registration fees are \in 100 per day or \in 180 for two days (special student prices are available).
